

AUTHOR INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMITTING MANUSCRIPTS FOR HEIR 2009

Arrangements have been made to publish all of the papers associated with the 10th International Conference on the Health Effects of Incorporated Radionuclides in the peer-reviewed journal *Health Physics*. Please follow the instructions below for producing and submitting your paper.

1. Each paper will go through peer review. Once all acceptable papers have been received by the *Health Physics* journal, they will be published in a special issue. By arrangement with the Editor, each paper will be limited to 5 journal pages. The page charges for these 5 pages will be paid by the organizers. If your final paper exceeds 5 journal pages, you will be responsible for paying \$65 per extra page.

3. For your information, 3 pages of 12-point type in Times New Roman script in MS Word equals about 1 journal page. Figures and tables take up space depending on their respective size. Smaller figures or tables take up about a quarter of a page. Larger ones can take up half to a full page.
4. When submitting your manuscript, please be aware that each table and each figure must be submitted as a separate file, not embedded in the text document. The preferred formats for figure files are *.tiff, *.eps or *.ppt.
5. HPJ is requesting that each author identify the paper as being part of the HEIR Issue. Please enter "part of the special HEIR ISSUE" in the comments section when uploading the manuscript file.
6. The deadline for submission of your manuscript to *Health Physics* is 15 May 2009.
